Planted hops will grow well on an 18-foot trellis and can grow vigorously when limited to 12 - 15 feet of trellis. Choose a spot with good drainage. 3. Hop Growing Guide - How to Grow Your Own Hops at Home Since hops prefer to climb, you should plant your hop vines close to a fence or wall, or rig posts, along the tops of which you can run line, which will enable you to support multiple vines (see image below). Plants must reach heights of 15 to 20 feet (4.5 to 6 m.) before they grow side shoots that produce cones, and can reach heights of 30 to 40 feet (9 to 12 m.) each growing season. In ... Planting Hops Plants The rhizome will need to be planted about four inches deep in aerated soil rich in nutrients with good drainage. Plant the rhizome horizontally, or with any visible buds pointing up. If planting more than one at a time, or different varieties together, place them at least 2ft apart to allow the roots space to grow. A Complete Guide to Growing Hops | Love The Garden For the optimal hops-in-a-pot experience, get your hands on a 20-inch planter and plant a single rhizome in the center. Place your rhizomes vertically, and make sure that the buds are pointing up towards the surface of the soil. Bury about two inches deep.

7. How to Grow Hops at Home • Hop Culture Growing hops is easy. They need well-worked soil in a sunny spot (with six to eight hours of sun). The rhizomes merely have to be planted with the growth tips facing up. Hops vines (also called bines) take off when the soil and air temperatures warm up in spring.
