The oral health assessment tool--validity and reliability Assess the mouth for dryness and breath for odor. A typical flow of saliva is vital in keeping the teeth clean. Halitosis can be due to dryness of the mouth, dentition, or any medical condition. Assess the patient's ability to complete regular oral care. Patients may need assistance in completing oral care. The Oral Assessment Guide (OAG) can assist in determining the patient's oral health and function. Each of the eight categories is scored 1, 2 or 3.
