This work was serialised in The Call Divine, a Bombay magazine that regularly featured articles by Bhagavan's devotees. The material was never published in book form, although I have been told that Lakshman Sarma's family are now looking into the possibility of publishing the whole work. I met Ganapati Muni for the first time in 1926. Muni's son, Sri Mahadeva Sastry, was my Sanskrit teacher in the Municipal High School where I studied. The Muni used to come to the school

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
