In basic form, the Transcription Technique has just two steps: Listen to a recording in your target language, and transcribe (write down) the recording as you listen. Record yourself speaking the

text that you've written down. You then repeat these two steps until you've mastered that piece of text. The Transcription Technique: A Simple Way to Improve Your ... There should be no more than 2 mistakes for every 10 comprehensible words spoken. Start a new paragraph with each new speaker and they should be separated with an empty line. Fillers (you know, like, etc.) and Utterances (Uh, Um, etc.) should be omitted unless it's strict verbatim.
